## Bachelor of Music: Performance Concentration: Vocal Requirement Notes

$+\quad$ The total number of credits required for graduation for the Vocal Concentration is 123 . Because the 8 credits for Music Assembly do not count towards graduation, and the 4 credits for Classroom Piano (although not required) are included in the semester credit totals, the grand total of required course credits add up to more than 123 credits.
$\wedge \wedge \quad$ Registration in Music Assembly is required in every semester of registration in Applied Major Lessons.
< Students must follow the music and Liberal Arts course requirements in effect at the time of the student's initial year of enrollment.

- Music Theory Elective may include a Theory IV topic not previously completed or Jazz Theory I. Theory IV is offered every semester with varying topics.
* A 60-minute Senior Recital is required for graduation. The senior recital cannot be scheduled if a student has a grade of Unsatisfactory in any semester of Music Assembly.
** All Bachelor of Music students (with the exception of classical piano performance majors) must take the Piano Proficiency Exam by the end of the $2^{\text {nd }}$ year and must pass the exam in order to graduate. Courses in piano are available to prepare students for this examination.
~ Vocal Performance majors are required to take 4 semesters of chamber music. This requirement can be satisfied by taking the Chamber Music course (07:701: 355, 356, 455, or 456) or from taking one of the Small Ensembles listed in the Music Undergraduate Handbook. Only 1 semester of Rutgers New Music Workshop (07:701:307) may be used to satisfy this requirement. Opera Workshop (701: 353 or 354 ) may be counted as chamber music.
$\sim \quad$ Voice majors must take Diction for Singers (701:201-202), can satisfy 2 terms of Chamber Music.
$\wedge \quad$ Vocal Pedagogy $(701: 415+416)$ is a two-semester requirement.
$\gamma \quad$ Vocal Coaching $(701: 302+402)$ is required in the $3^{\text {rd }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ years of study.
A total of 8 ( 5 music \& 3 "free") elective credits are needed in order to earn the 120 credits required for graduation.
- To fulfill the 3 credits of music electives, courses may be selected from any 300 - or 400 -level music courses not being counted towards the music major requirements, or 200 -level music courses pending approval by the Music Undergraduate Advisor. Students may use Classroom Piano to satisfy 4 of the 6 music elective credits.
- To fulfill the 5 credits of free electives, courses may be selected from any music or non-music courses not being counted towards the major requirements.
\% Musics and Cultures (07:700:203) is not required for students who have already completed Ethnomusicology (07:700:303) or for students who must take Ethnomusicology in the 2024-25 academic year due to schedule conflicts.
